A Proud History

- one of the oldest girls' schools in HK, founded in 1900
- as a pioneer in pre-school education, established a kindergarten in 1910s
- has played a leading role in women's education in HK society
- the first secondary school:
 - to have a student union the Student Association ("SA") was founded in 1949 and YWGS has a strong tradition of student autonomy with extra-curricular activities run mainly by students. The SA co-ordinates all planning and implementation of student activities concerning student welfare, community services, sports activities and publication of the school newspaper "Clarion".
 - to organize sponsored walks YWGS organized its first annual sponsored walk in 1969, two years before the Community Chest established its own walk. About HK\$190,000 was raised in the 2005 sponsored walk and most of the funds were donated to local charitable organizations.

A. School Mission

- aims to provide quality education of a Christian character with emphasis on "whole person" development which embraces the moral, intellectual, physical, social, aesthetic and spiritual nurturing of every student
- cultivates in students a noble character, a positive and healthy attitude to life, a keen sense of responsibility and commitment to school, family, Hong Kong community, China and the world
- the school motto is "Time is precious, treasure every minute. (寸陰是惜)"

B Facts about the School

In July 2006, the school had a total of 1,163 students in 31 classes with the following class structure:

Secondary 1 – 3: 5 classes in each level

Secondary 4 – 5: 5 classes in each level, with 3 in Arts and

2 in Science

Secondary 6 – 7: 3 classes in each level, with 2 in Arts and

1 in Science

- In Secondary 1 to 3, students are offered a broad general curriculum with a good balance among languages, arts, science, cultural and practical subjects as well as religious education and physical education.
- In the senior forms, a broad selection of subjects is offered to students who can choose the Arts, Science or Commercial streams.







- Besides preparing students to sit for public examinations, career guidance is offered to help further studies and career development. Most graduates gain admission to either local or overseas universities.
- As an Anglo-Chinese school, YWGS adopts English as the medium of instruction in most subjects with the aim of achieving biliteracy (Chinese and English) and trilingualism with the inclusion of Putonghua.
