Objectives:	To train leadership & volleyball skills through interacting with Thailand players and understanding their culture

Title:	Mathematics Team Training
Objectives:	To provide structured training sessions, service opportunities and to join Inter-school Mathematics Competitions
Deliverables:	Students have to attend 8 afterschool training sessions.
Target:	S4 and S5 Mathematics Team Members (High ability in Mathematics)
Selection mechanism:	Members are selected based on their latest examination results on Mathematics and their past training records on Mathematics Competition. Teacher recommendation and student's choice are also considered.
Duration and venue:	From Oct 2017 to Mar 2018 Venues: i. Training: within school ii. Service: within and outside school iii. Competitions: Outside school
Evaluation:	<p>The training sessions were completed smoothly and the students were given opportunities to join various external Mathematics competitions, including Pui Ching Invitational Mathematics Competition, Secondary School Mathematics & Science Competition and Hong Kong Mathematics Olympiad.</p> <p>Besides, team leaders were responsible to promote mathematics in school through co-curricular activities. They have organized 3 mathematics games for the whole school and presented 1 thematic board display at school. They also participated in the Brainstorm Programme, initiated by the Mathematics Department, to train the S1 schoolmates on board games and chess. Some of them joined the service programme of visiting an elderly centre and played board games with the elderly. They assisted as the MCs of the S3 Mathematics Competition.</p> <p>Overall speaking, the training was comprehensive and students had learnt both mathematics knowledge, competition and leadership skills. They were also encouraged to serve with a caring heart.</p>
Expenditure:	Total course fee charged for structured training sessions = \$9,600 Subsidy from DLG = \$7,000

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Title:	Public Speaking Workshop (Organizer: The University of Hong Kong Summer Institute)
Objectives:	- To develop students' leadership skills and public speaking skills
Deliverables:	- A debriefing session after the completion of the programme - Participant applies the skills learnt from the programme in different school-based programmes (as a helper)
Target:	S6 students (2017 – 2018)
Selection mechanism:	- Teacher's nomination - Sound academic performance and potential / existing student leaders.
Duration and venue:	- 16 – 19 July 2018 (Course Fee: \$2,800)
Evaluation:	After discussing with the student participant, the programme was able to:- - nurture students with solid fundamental knowledge and intensive leadership skills; - foster all-round training to strengthen students' critical thinking and reasoning skills, interpersonal skills, cognitive skills and ability to analyse and solve problems.
Expenditure:	- 1 S6 student (Subsidy under the DLG 2017-2018: <u>\$1,400</u>)
