	Due to class suspension of the social movement and the pandemic situation, some of the training sessions were conducted online by means of videos-on-demand. As the communication with team members became difficult, some members found it difficult to access the videos and did not raise out. This was discovered later when they were asked to fill in their view time of the videos. In view of all these problems, in the coming year the following measures will be carried out. (1) Include terms related to possible change to online training sessions in agreements with coaches and service providers. (2) Details of the following about online training sessions will be discussed and fixed before the commencement of the training sessions: the platforms to be used, the ways to distribute notes to team members, how attendance is to be taken, the channels through which our team members can communicate with the coaches and how evaluation is to be done. (3) eClassrooms will be set up for team members in each form. This will be used to share course materials and making announcements. (4) Arrangements of both face-to-face and online training sessions will be thoroughly explained to team members before the commencement of the training sessions.
	All competitions and service opportunities that our students used to participate
	in were cancelled due to different factors brought by the epidemic. It is hoped
	that the situation will improve soon so that our students could continue to

	participate in various mathematical competitions.
